SUPERVISED DRIVING LOG

DL-008A
(Rev. 01/26)

An individual who is qualified to sign for a minor in accordance with SC Code of Law §56-1-100(A)(1-7) and who has a valid driver's license may use this log as a tool to track the required 40 hours of supervised driving practice (10 hours must be night driving) for their teen. The supervised driving practice is in addition to the driver training requirements. The use of this log is optional and is provided for your convenience. This supervised driving practice requirement cannot be completed by a driver training school, another family member or friend, it must be done by **someone who is qualified to sign for a minor in accordance with the referenced SC Code of Law section above**. If the teen does not have someone who can fulfill this obligation then the teen does not qualify for a conditional or restricted license in accordance with SC Code of Law Section 56-1-175 and 56-1-180.

DRIVING SKILLS TO PRACTICE

All skills in each level should be mastered before attempting the next level. The abbreviations listed below can be used to identify the driving skills practiced and those that need more practice.

Level I

Backing Up the Car (BUC)
Driving a "Stick" (DS)
Lane Choice and Control (LCC)
Left Turn/Right Turn (LT/RT)
Looking Ahead in Traffic (LAT)
Starting and Stopping the Car (SSC)

Level II

Intersections (I)
Keeping Space Around the Car (KSAC)
Lane Changes (LC)
Practicing in Traffic (PT)

Level III

Parking on Hills (PH)
Parallel Parking (PP)
U-Turn (UT)

Level IV

Interstate Driving (ID)
Night Driving (ND)
Adverse Conditions (AC) such as:

- Road construction zones
- Stalled vehicles
- Extreme weather conditions (rain, snow, ice, wind)

Special Problems and Emergencies (SPE) such as:

- Changing a tire
- Involved in an accident
- Stalled or disabled vehicle

Inclement weather (rain, snow, ice, wind)
